2026 Winfree Budget - The Stewardship Committee recommended to the Winfree Church Counsel that the 2026 budget of \$1,714,000 be approved. Church Council approved the 2026 budget, which was voted upon/approved at the November 2026 business meeting.

2026 OneFund January through March Summary

- 2026 January – March OneFund Giving was \$384,048
 - Exceeds 2025 1st quarter giving by \$3,326 (+.87%)
 - Exceeds 2024 1st quarter giving by \$27,374 (+7.6%)

2026 Winfree Budget Income vs Expenses (3 months)

- 2026 1st quarter OneFund donations totaled \$384,048. Our OneFund goal/budget is \$428,500, therefore, we are \$44,451 behind in budgeted giving.
- 2026 1st quarter Total Expenses are \$426,158 against a 1st quarter expense budget of \$432,267. Our expenses are \$6,109 below the budgeted expenses for 1st quarter 2026 but exceeded giving by \$42,110.
- In summary, we are doing a good job keeping expenses down over 3 months, but we are lagging behind in OneFund donations.

CCHASM Mission No Longer Funded

- The Chesterfield Colonial Heights Alliance for Social Ministry (CCHASM) ceased operating in April. Winfree church's financial support to CCHASM was \$1,200 per year/\$100 per month. We had already sent CCHASM \$300 in support before their operation shut down. The Stewardship Committee motioned and passed a resolution to stop further support of CCHASM (Budget Line 51100), and to redirect the remaining budgeted \$900 to a mission to be selected by Winfree leadership. The Stewardship Committee voted in favor of not putting any restrictions on the \$900 other than to spread the Word of God and Serve Others.

Stewardship Committee's Guidance for 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Quarters

- All of our Winfree Committees are showing frugality and care with their spending. However, we experienced an especially cold and snowy February/March, costing Winfree snow clearing and higher heating costs. We are also doing our best to replace lobby furniture. These events caused high expenses for our Buildings & Grounds Team. The Stewardship Committee is prayerful and hopeful that the remainder of the year will be less expensive.

Future Concerns

- In the next few years, Winfree Church will need to make expensive upgrades to our Worship Center's audio and video equipment. We need to start preparing for those expenses.

Endowment – Dee Slaughter, Chair

Since the last Business Meeting, the Committee has not met.

- **Financial Update** - the Fund balance as of 4/13/2026 is \$287,449.
- **Congregation Education** – As reported at the last Business Meeting, there is a need

to communicate the purpose and structure of the Endowment Fund. The Committee discussed and unanimously agreed that it is important to develop an effective education plan regarding the Fund's purpose and structure for the Congregation. Chairman Slaughter agreed to coordinate with Church Staff and the Leadership Group to formulate a communication strategy for this purpose.

Property & Space – Scott Barlow, Chair

Since the last business meeting, the following projects have been completed:

- Interior directory signage has been installed in key areas to make visitors feel comfortable navigating the church.
- All of the kitchen appliance operating manuals have been collected and kitchen cleaning schedules have been developed. Both the manuals and schedules are now available in the kitchen.
- The old, cracked wooden exterior doors for the Bunker and Boiler Room have been replaced with metal doors.

Projects that are currently in progress:

- The inverter to turn on the emergency lights in the Worship Center is not fully functional and has been evaluated by a technician. Forty (40) batteries will be replaced within the inverter.
- The furniture for the Worship Center lobby furniture has been ordered with an expected arrival during the second half of May.
- One of the HVAC units for the preschool needs to be replaced in the near future. It is 16-years old and near the end of its life. We are currently working with the selected vendor, Colonial Webb, to schedule the replacement work.

- Our committee worked alongside a group led by Rev. Jimmy Doan as they searched for an Associate Minister of Children and Families. As a result of the search team's hard work, Lisa Lynch was called and approved by the congregation at the April 19th business meeting. Lisa will join our staff in early May. A big thanks goes to the search team.
- Attention now goes to a search for a Traditional Worship Leader which will involve meetings with the adult choir to help craft a job description, after which a search will be implemented. Pray for wisdom in finding the right candidate to fill this position.
- We continue to work on changes for Winfree's Personnel Policy and Procedure Manual. This includes reviewing all job positions and responsibilities to better define duties properly. Recommendations will be referred to Church Council for review, possible edits and recommended approval.

- Weekday Preschool Director - As the school year comes to a close in June, we will be assisting the Weekday Preschool Committee and Rev. Foster to assemble a group to find a replacement for the Director position. As with the Traditional Worship Leader position, we covet your prayers during this process.

Austria Missions Partnership*

a. Winfree Church Welcomes David Bunce

Rev. David Bunce who serves as pastor of Bad Ischl Baptist and as Secretary General of the Baptist Union of Austria will be joining in person at Winfree Church, the weekend of May 1-3, 2026. As you know, David was supposed to join us on Sunday January 25, but he was able to delay his trip past the winter weather.

When David comes, we will host a dinner for him and members of Church Council, Missions Committee, and members of the team who have gone and are going to Bad Ischl at the end of May. This meeting will allow leaders of the church to hear more about opportunities within Bad Ischl and the Austrian Baptist Union.

b. Mission Trip

May 24 through June 1, Winfree Church will be taking another team to Bad Ischl to help with their Long Night of the Churches event that will take place on May 29. Long Night of the Churches is a national event where churches are encouraged by the government to host community events in community spaces. These events across the country allow churches to engage with people in their communities, sometimes for the first time, and share about the church and what it does.

The Baptists of Bad Ischl are hosting and leading this community event in Bad Ischl and we are going to help. There will be games and activities for kids, music, lessons, and information surrounding the idea of unity and love around the world. Our own Mark and Peggy Rutledge will be one of the speakers at this event.
