It was a display of welcome, a public act of honor and homage, a ceremonial acknowledgment. “Our true King has come, just as was foretold.” The disciples first, and then many in the crowd. Removing outer garments and laying them before the Christ, the anointed one. Preparing the way.

Preparing the way for Jesus requires removing our outer garments and laying them at His feet. This is a sacrifice we must make if He is to be our King. What outer cloak are you placing in the road before Him? A garment woven from fear, guilt, or shame? The cloak of status or self-reliance?

Whatever it is, take it off. Lay it down before Him. Welcome Him. Jesus longs for a transformed inner life. In being baptized into Christ, we are to be clothed with Him. (Gal. 3:27) Clothed with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, and above all, love. (Col. 3:12-14). Take off your outer garment and invite King Jesus to enter in.
