

## Administrative Team Reports - Scott Barlow and Mike Oberschmidt

## **Stewardship** - Glenn Taylert, Chair

Kudos to us, as we have seen a 1% increase in giving;

- OneFund giving from January through August has been \$927,588, which is slightly higher than last year at this time.
- Our spending has been approximately \$80,000 less than projected, reflecting spending of \$866,381 vs. a 7-month budget of \$945,344.
- Several areas of spending including Technology Support, Buildings and Grounds, Stewardship, and office expenses are key areas, but the Stewardship Committee, other committee leads, and staff are carefully monitoring these areas.
  - Our facilities are aging, so replacement and repair costs are high. Some high-cost items have contingency funds in our budget (roof replacement).
  - We have also invested in technological upgrades, such as our online streaming.
     Not all of these expenses will occur yearly, but will require fine tuning.

#### **2026 Winfree Budget**

Our guidance for the 2026 Winfree Budget will be to maintain expenses at or below the previous fiscal year wherever possible. Any proposed increases should be accompanied by clear justification, demonstrating alignment with the church's ministry priorities and available resources, ensuring faithful stewardship, financial stability and responsible planning for the future. Budget requests must be submitted by the end of September.

## **Endowment** - Dee Slaughter, Chair

The endowment committee met on July 27, 2025 and the fund had a balance of \$260,395, with an annual return on investment of 6.21% as of June 30, 2025.

- Extended the contract with Dr. Clingenpeel for 6 months with an opt-out clause, as his contract ended in May
- Devised an interim bonus plan for staff for the second and third quarters as they have had a heavier workload due to Dr. Benjamin's departure
- Collaborated with the Pastor Search Committee to develop a financial package for our new pastor, Rev. Lee Foster; will assist as they relocate.
- Worked with Leadership group related to a recommendation to develop codirectors of the Children's Ministry, in the absence of a full-time Children's Minister. Nicole Flournoy and Lisa Radke appointed as of August 7, 2025, as codirectors.
- Subcommittee of the Personnel Committee have worked on staff budget recommendations; this work will continue through September.
- Received Carolne Hankinson's letter of resignation effective August 12, 2025. They are working with the staff to develop interim plans for coverage as well as a plan for replacement.
- Evaluating the Winfree Policy and Procedure Manual; any changes will be brought to Church Council.
- Evaluating potential implementation of Social Media guidelines for staff. Recommendations will wait until the new Senior Pastor is in place.
- Recognition that Kelsea Burton has really stepped up and been of great assistance since Caroline's resignation.

## **Stewardship** - Glenn Taylert, Chair

#### 2025 OneFund January through September

• OneFund giving for January through September 2025 was \$1,026,579. Budgeted income is \$1,074,488 for the same period.

#### 2025 Budget Spending January through September P&L

• Overall budget spending was \$1,124,246 against a budget of \$1,215,442. This means that we have spent 92.5% (\$91,196 under budget) of our 9-month budget.

#### 2025 Stewardship Meeting Schedule

• Our committee last met on October 30, 2025. Next meeting is planned for November 20, 2025

#### Other – Requests for Funding outside of 2025 Budget

- Property & Space requested the purchase of a new oven/stove for our kitchen. The
  current oven meets all of the requirements for replacement. Final cost will include
  delivery, removal of old oven, warranty, and upgrades to electrical in kitchen.
  Estimated cost of the oven is expected to be \$3,700; however, cost of electrical
  upgrades have not been finalized.
- Property & Space requested money to replace furniture in the Worship Center Lobby. The Stewardship Committee did not reach consensus to approve, and decided to delay a decision until a later date. The Stewardship Committee supports our need to upgrade our lobby furniture and will be working with Property & Space to make changes in the lobby.

## 2026 Winfree Budget

- The Stewardship Committee received all proposed budgets from all committees and ministries on a timely basis. Requests were reviewed by Stewardship and forwarded to the Church Council after a thorough analysis process description below. Church Council reviewed the Stewardship Committee's recommendation, made a few changes, and submitted the proposed 2026 back to the Stewardship Committee for final review. After final review on October 30, the Stewardship Committee agreed to submit the attached budget at the 11/19/25 Business Meeting for approval recommendation below.
- Budget building process this year included processing over 60 separate line-item requests, checking them against the 2025 budget, working with Mission leads when questions arise, entering data into spreadsheets, analyzing 2026 expenditures vs. anticipated 2026 OneFund income, and other due diligence.
- We appreciate all of the hard work from our Winfree Staff, our Treasurers, and everyone involved in our ministries and committees.

**Recommendation:** The Stewardship Committee unanimously recommends the Church approve the 2026 Budget in the amount of \$1,714,000 as presented. The Stewardship Committee is authorized to adjust the budget by 2% without the consent of the Church. If such changes are necessary, all adjustments will be reported.
