3 New ICDC Units



We are grateful to have opened 3 new Integrated Child Development Centers in the Chalbi Desert of Northern Kenya: Ola Rangi ICDC, Olom ICDC and Ola Boji. These centers serve the communities of the Gabra people who live near the Ethiopian border. Having access to these centers allows the youngest ones consistent feeding and nutrition, basic kindergarten education according to the Kenyan curriculum, clean water, treated mosquito net distribution, as well as a safe place to grow and thrive.
